CODE OF ETHICS OUTLINE:

Commitment to the Players

1. General members shall put the welfare of their athletes above their own competitive behavior to "WIN" and maintain an appropriate behavior during all events, games, etc.
2. General Members shall be considerate to all athletes and encourage them, in a positive manner. Good sportsmanship is expected at all times for players, coaches, umpires, etc.
3. General Members shall set forth a good example during highly competitive games.
4. General Members will treat players with dignity and respect at all times; understanding that they are also role models who set examples for young players as well as maintaining a respectful role with the opposing team & it's coaching staff, players, parents, & umpires.

Commitment to the Institution

1. General Members shall behave in such a way that they shall bring credit the organization and to themselves. Insubordinate behavior will not be tolerated, any behavior deemed detrimental to the organization, will be documented & may be subject to membership revocation.
2. All volunteers, General members (parents) need to have and show professional behavior while they are representing OCGSA, during the season.
3. General members shall act in full accordance with OCGSA and ASA/USA softball rules.
4. Parents (general members) will openly communicate with TC & Manger of the team in regards to mandatory fundraising, special events & mandatory snack bar coverage. All special circumstance MUST be communicated up front and NOT at the last minute by the parent to the coach/TC.

Commitment to other Coaches

1. Player/Parent (general member) Commitment to the coaches and the coach's commitment to the player/parent is an equal partnership. Be respectful. We are all here for the girls.
2. All umpires and coaches shall be treated in a professional and respectable manner.
3. Any displeasure with a coach, umpire's &/OR any board member of the association shall be addressed through the proper channels/procedures and NOT through other channels, including, but not limited to social media &/or gossip.

Every registered player (and parents/family), approved coach/TC & board member will be held to this common practice of ethics through the registration process of your player, each season. Non-compliance of OCGSA Code of Ethics may result in suspension or revocation of membership based on the severity of violation.
