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SUPERVISION AND ADMINISTRATION

1. The head of the league shall be the Athletics Supervisor and/or Parks and Recreation Department (PARD) representative.
2. In all matters not covered by American Cornhole Organization, the Athletics Coordinator and/or Parks and Recreation Department (PARD) representative shall have jurisdiction.

TEAMS AND ELIGIBILITY

1. All league teams must have a roster on record with Round Rock PARD.
2. No less than two (2) players and no maximum number of players can be carried on a roster at any time.
3. Each team will have a point of contact who serves as a liaison between their players and PARD as well as between their players and officials.
4. Teams have up until the fourth week of the season to make changes to their roster. All changes must go through the Athletics Coordinator with PARD to be official.
5. All participants must be 21 years of age or older prior to their first scheduled game.
6. Players may only play on one team per season.

SCHEDULES

1. This league will consist of a minimum of eight (8) games for each team. Depending on the number of teams registered, teams may play up to two games a night. Playoffs will occur after regular season play has ended. The top four (4) teams will move on to compete in a single elimination tournament to determine the league champions.
2. Game schedules will be posted on www.TeamSideline.com/RoundRock.
3. Once game schedules are posted, there will be no rescheduled games due to team conflicts. Exception - games that are canceled due to inclement weather or as determined by Parks and Recreation.

4. Any rainout games will be posted on our rainout line. Please call 512-671-2898 for an update. If there is an “old” message, current daily scheduled games are still on.

GAME RULES

A. FIELD OF PLAY/EQUIPMENT

1. Only players may be on the field of play unless requested by an official.
2. Cornhole boards and bags will be provided by RR PARD.
3. In each lane, boards will be placed 27 feet from each other (front to front).
4. Each team will be assigned a lane of play per game which consists of 2 cornhole boards and 8 bags.

B. GAME LENGTH

1. Matches shall be played to twenty-one (21) points. The first team to reach (or exceed) that amount at the conclusion of a match is the winner.
2. Teams will play best out of 3 matches. The team with the most match wins gets the overall win against their opponent.
3. Regulation game time limit is 40 minutes. If the time limit is reached in the middle of an inning, the inning shall be completed.

C. SCORING

1. Scoring is assessed at the end of the frame based on net scoring (lowest team point total subtracted from the highest team point total). First team to twenty-one (21) points is the match winner. Best out of 3 matches is the overall winner.
 - Cornhole – 3 points - Refers to any cornhole bag that has been pitched and passes through the cornhole board hole at any time within the frame.
 - Woody – 1 point - Refers to any cornhole bags that has been pitched and remains on the cornhole board playing surface at the conclusion of the frame.
 - Foul Bags – 0 points - Refers to any cornhole bag that has not been determined as a “woody” or “cornhole” or was designated a foul bag as the result of rules violation.
 - Pitching a bag with a foot over the foul line (front of your teams cornhole board).

- A pitched cornhole bag that contacts the ground before coming to rest on the board.
 - A pitched cornhole bag that contacts other out-of-bounds obstructions before coming to rest on the board.
 - Pitching a bag overhand.
 - Any bags on the board that are knocked off by a foul pitch shall be returned as close to the initial position.
2. Scores shall be reported to the official once complete.

D. PLAY

1. Prior to the first game, one player from each team will meet to determine the initial pitching order with a game of rock, paper, scissors. Teams will alternate the initial pitches for every game thereafter.
2. All games are doubles play only.
3. Players are not allowed to alternate into a game until the end of the inning.
4. Pitches are alternated between players on each side until all (8) bags are thrown.
5. Players may only throw one bag at a time.
6. Each team must stand on the same side of the board.

DETERMINING DIVISION WINNERS

The number of teams competing in the playoffs will be determined by the total number of teams in the league and will consist of a single elimination tournament.

1. This tournament will be held the week following the last regular season night. In the event of two (2) or more teams in the same league having the same win/loss record at the conclusion of the scheduled season, the results of head-to-head competition during the regular season will be used. If still tied, the team scoring the most points during regular season will be ranked above the other team.
2. Awards: The team that wins the single elimination tournament will receive championship trophies.

OFFICIAL

1. A Game official will be scheduled by the Parks and Recreation Department.
2. The official will be located onsite. He/she is responsible for the supervision of

- games and enforcement of all program rules.
3. The official will have total control of the field during all games.

CONDUCT of PARTICIPANTS and SPECTATORS:

1. Players are responsible for the conduct of their teams and spectators during games.
2. The conduct of the player is the responsibility of the player. Poor behavior displayed by any player or spectator, will not be tolerated. This is at the discretion of the game official and any PARD representative.
3. Please be courteous and remember that field time is set for participants. Please keep spectators off the court area and quiet so that the teams can compete during games.
4. Officials are responsible for maintaining order on the field. An official has the authority to eject any person off the field and/or facility.
5. Any player or spectator being ejected from a game will automatically be reviewed by the Athletics Supervisor and/or a Parks and Recreation (PARD) representative. Any further discipline, if needed, will be at the discretion of PARD.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY:
