

WINFIELD RECREATION COMMISSION YOUTH RECREATIONAL SOCCER 3-YEAR-OLD LEAGUE

Rule 1. - THE FIELD

A. DIMENSIONS. The field shall be rectangular, its length being not more than 35 yards nor less than 25 yards and its width not more than 25 yards or less than 15 yards. The length in all cases shall exceed the width.

Rule 2. - THE BALL: Size three (3).

Rule 3. – NUMBER OF PLAYERS

- A. Maximum number of players, per team, on the field at any one time: FOUR (4). A goalkeeper is **not** used. Full backs, if used, should NOT be stationed in the goal area let them play!
- B. Maximum number of players on the roster shall not exceed seven (7).
- C. Substitutions Players should be substituted at the 3-minute mark in each quarter or as needed to allow for equal amount of playing time. Substitutions may occur at any stoppage of play, such as throw-in, goal kick, corner kick, after a score, or for any injury.
- D. Each player shall have equal playing time. All positions shall be rotated as best as possible.

Rule 4. - PLAYERS EQUIPMENT

- A. Shirt
- B. Shorts or pants
- C. Shin guards: MANDATORY
- D. Shoes: Shall be safe tennis shoes or soccer cleats. No steel-toed cleats will be allowed.
- E. No jewelry, watches, rings, belts, earrings or anything dangerous to players shall be permitted.

Rule 5. – THE REFEREE

- A. There will be one official on the field. Each team will be allowed to have one (1) coach on the field to help control the game while also instructing.
- B. The game is for the players and the primary function of the Coach/Official is to ensure:
 - 1. **SAFETY** of the players (stop play for any dangerous situation and for any injury)
 - 2. **EQUALITY** of play. Don't allow any player to gain an advantage from any of the infractions listed in Rule 11.
 - ENJOYMENT of all players and spectators. Focus on the Positive aspects of individual skills and team play and above all, ENCOURAGE GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP!

Rule 6. - DURATION OF THE GAME

- A. The game shall be divided in four (4) equal six (6) minute quarters.
- B. There shall be a one (1) minute break between quarters with a five (5) minute half time between the second and third quarters.



Rule 7. – THE START OF PLAY

- A. Kickoff from the center circle will take place at the start of each period. The Home team on the schedule shall kickoff for the odd numbered quarters (1st & 3rd), and the Visiting Team will Kick-off for the even numbered quarters (2nd & 4th). The teams **DO NOT** change ends at half.
- B. Kickoff after each goal by the team giving up the goal.
- C. All players must be on their half of the field when the ball is kicked, and the defending players must be outside the center circle.
- D. The ball is in play when it is kicked and clearly moves. It can be kicked backwards.
- E. The player taking the kickoff may not touch the ball again until it has been touched by any other player violation results in a re-kick for the original kicking team.
- F. A goal **CANNOT** be scored directly from a kickoff.

Rule 8. - BALL IN AND OUT OF PLAY

- A. The ball **is out** of play when:
 - 1. it has completely crossed the goal-line or touch-line, whether on the ground or in the air.
 - 2. the Coach/Official has stopped play.
- B. The ball **is in** play at all other times from the start of the match to the finish including:
 - 1. If it rebounds from a goal-post, cross-bar or corner-flag into the field of play.
 - 2. If it rebounds off the Coach/Official when they are in the field of play.

Rule 9. - METHOD OF SCORING

- A. The whole of the ball must completely cross the goal-line below the cross-bar and between the goal-posts.
- B. A goal may only be scored from a touch (offensive or defensive) within the team's offensive half of the field. The ball must be completely on the offensive half of the field and cannot be touching the mid-line (Example: kick-off). If a player in their defensive half kicks the ball across the midline and the ball hits another player (offensive or defensive) in their offensive half, and the ball goes into the goal, a goal will be awarded. If a ball is kicked from the defensive half and is not touched before the ball rests in the goal, a goal kick is awarded to the defensive team.

Rule 10. - OFF-SIDE

There shall be no off-side.



Rule 11. -FOULS AND MISCONDUCT

- A. All fouls will result in an INDIRECT FREE KICK. The opponents must be five (5) yards from the ball.
- B. The Coach/Official must explain ALL infractions to the offending player.

A player who commits any of the following six offences in a manner considered by the Coach/Official to be careless, reckless or involving disproportionate force:

- 1. kicks or attempts to kick an opponent; or
- 2. trips an opponent; or
- 3. jumps at an opponent; or
- 4. charges an opponent; or
- 5. strikes or attempts to strike and opponent; or
- 6. pushes an opponent; or

who commits any of the following offences:

- 1. when tackling an opponent makes contact with the opponent before contact is made with the ball; or
- 2. holds an opponent; or
- 3. spits at an opponent; or
- 4. handles the ball deliberately, i.e., carries, strikes or propels the ball with his/her hand or arm.

DO NOT STOP PLAY FOR EVERY INCIDENT. THE RULES OF THE GAME ARE INTENDED TO PROVIDE THAT THE GAME SHOULD BE PLAYED WITH AS LITTLE INTERFERENCE AS POSSIBLE, AND IN THIS VIEW IT IS THE DUTY OF THE COACH/OFFICIAL TO PENALISE ONLY DELIBERATE BREACHES OF THE LAW.

Rule 13. -FREE KICKS

- A. All free kicks shall be classified as INDIRECT.
- B. The ball is in play when it is kicked and moves (Minimal movement is required).
- C. A goal **may not** be scored directly from an indirect free kick, it must be touched by another player, any other player.
- D. The ball must be stationary when the free kick is taken.
- E. The kicker shall not play the ball a second time until it has been touched by another player (the violation results in an indirect free kick for the opponents).
- F. All opposing players must be at least five (5) yards from the ball.

Rule 14. -PENALTY KICKS

No penalty kicks are to be taken during these games.

Rule 15. -THROW-IN/KICK-IN

- A. A Kick-in shall take the place for any throw-ins.
- B. Shall be taken when the ball has completely crossed the touch-line-either on the ground or in the air.
- C. Taken by player of the team opposing the team that last touched the ball before it went out of play.
- D. The thrower/kicker shall not play the ball again until it has been touched by another player, any other player (violation results in an indirect free kick for the opponents).
- E. Opponents need to be 5 yards away from the spot of the kick-in.
- F. A goal cannot be scored directly from a kick-in.



Rule 16. -GOAL KICK

- A. Shall be taken when:
 - 1. the ball has completely crossed the goal-line (either on the ground or in the air)
 - 2. not below the cross-bar and between the goal-posts; and
 - 3. was last touched by a player of the attacking team.
- B. The goal kick is taken by a player on the defending team from anywhere within the goal area.
- C. Defending players may be anywhere on the field.
- D. Attacking players must be at a minimum five (5) yards from the goal area.
- E. The player who kicks the ball may not touch or play the ball again until it has been touched by another player outside of the penalty area (violation results in re-kicking the goal kick).
- F. A goal may not be scored directly from a goal kick.

Rule 17. -CORNER KICK

- A. Shall be taken when:
 - the ball has completely crossed the goal-line-either on the ground or in the air;
 and
 - 2. not below the cross-bar and between the goal-posts; and
 - 3. was last touched by a player of the defending team
- B. The corner kick is taken by a player on the attacking team from the corner arc nearest to the point where the ball went out.
- C. Attacking players may be anywhere on the field
- D. Defending players must be five (5) yards away from the ball.
- E. The kicker cannot touch the ball again until it has been touched or played by another player (violation results in an indirect free kick for the opponents).
- F. A goal may be scored directly from a corner kick.

Rule 18. - HEADING

- A. Deliberate heading of the ball will not be allowed
- B. If a player deliberately heads the ball in a game, an indirect free kick should be awarded to the opposing team from the spot of the offense.
