



LOYBL/ORBA Combined Special Rules

Pony/Senior (15U)

<u>Pitching Rules</u>- Will adhere to LOYBL Pitch counts. The week is Sunday-Saturday.

- 80 Pitches in one calendar day.
- 160 Pitches in one week.
- Mandatory rest will be enforced based on the following table of pitches thrown in a day.
 - 0-20 Pitches may pitch the next day.
 - o 21-35 pitches may pitch after one full calendar day.
 - o 36-50 pitches may pitch after two full calendar days.
 - o 51-max may pitch after three full calendar days.

<u>Game Timing</u>- No new inning may start after the official game time hits 1 hour 50 minutes. There will be no Drop-dead time.

7 innings max per game or time limit, whichever comes first.

<u>Mercy Rule</u>- A team reaching a lead of 15 runs at the end of the 5th inning, or any point thereafter will be declared the winner by mercy.

<u>Infield Fly Rule</u> -will be in effect.

<u>Batting Order-</u> All players on the team are in the batting line-up, whether they are playing in the field or not.

Equipment-

Bats WOOD, USABASEBALL OR BBCOR CERTIFIED BATS ONLY

Legal Bat Size (wooden bats may be used in all divisions).

- A. Diameter 2 5/8" or less
- B. Length 36" or less
- C. Maximum -5 weight
- D. Only bats meeting the USABaseball or BBCOR certification standards are allowed. The exception of the following BBCOR bats Axe Avenge and Marucci CAT5 33inch model these bats ARE NOT ALLOWED. The brand, length, weight, and measurement must be visible for the bat to be used. All USABaseball bats must bear the new licensing mark and all BBCOR bats must have the BBCOR certification mark, no stickers will be accepted.
- *Any batter who bats with an illegal bat with be called out. It is possible to forfeit a game under this rule. **USSSA bats are NOT allowed to be used in any division.**

• <u>CLEATS-</u> No metal cleats. Only plastic cleats may be worn. If a player on the field is found to be wearing metal cleats at any time, play will stop and will not continue until they have been replaced with plastic cleats or some other shoes. If the player has no other shoes to wear, he will not be allowed to continue playing in the game.

<u>Slide Rule-</u> Base runner does have to slide OR give himself up to avoid malicious contact. They will be called out if a deliberate attempt to bowl over defensive player is made. The intent is to avoid injury. Must be a legal slide, runner will be called out if the slide is ruled illegal and further acts may result in warning and/or ejected from the game. The runner will not be held responsible for sliding if the defensive player moves up the base path and makes contact with the runner.

<u>Courtesy runners</u>- are allowed for pitchers, catchers after they reach base (if there is at least 1 out), or an injured player. No replacing players after inning has started, except for injury. The courtesy runner is always last batted out. The same courtesy runner may not be used twice in one inning.

<u>Thrown Bat-</u> Any batter who is deemed in the Umpire's sole discretion to have deliberately thrown a bat is out. No warning will be given. An Umpire may, in their sole discretion, call out a batter who throws a bat but the throw is deemed indeliberate

<u>Dropped Third Strike-</u> Rule is in effect, i.e. a runner may advance to first base where a third strike is dropped by the catcher. A runner who does not make an effort to first base will be called out.

<u>Slide Rule</u> – A Base runner will be called out if a deliberate attempt to bowl over defensive player is made. The intent is to avoid injury. Must be a legal slide. The runner will be called out if the slide is ruled illegal and further acts may result in warning for the game. The runner will not be held responsible for sliding if the defensive player moves up the base path and makes contact with the runner.

<u>Injury-</u> If a coach/umpire removes a player for injury, this player in the batting order will not be considered an out.
