MPRB Adult Soccer Tournament Rules

- 1. Verbal abuse towards the officials will not be tolerated. Vulgar language during games on and off the field will not be permitted, and will result in an automatic Red Card.
- 2. The game clock will begin promptly at the scheduled game time.
- 3. If a player receives a **Yellow Card**, that player must sit out for five minutes.
- 4. If a player receives a **Red Card** (or two yellow cards) they must sit out the rest of the game and will not be able to play the remainder of the tournament.
- 5. Playing of non-registered or ineligible players is an automatic forfeiture.
- 6. Each team must wear a shirt/uniform of the same color.
- 7. Shin guards are required at all times during play.
- 8. Substitutions may be made on a dead ball by either team.
- 9. <u>Tie Breaker-</u> If the game is tied at the end of regulation. A shootout will take place to determine a winner. Officials and <u>team managers</u> only will assemble at midfield to review the procedure below.
 - a. The Official will determine which goal, kicks will be taken at.
 - b. Each team manager will select <u>five players</u> from their roster to take the kicks.
 - c. A coin toss will be conducted. The winning team will decide to kick first or second.
 - d. Teams will alternate kickers.
 - e. The defending team may change goalkeepers prior to each kick.
 - f. Following the five kicks, the team scoring the greater number of goals is declared the winner.
 - g. If still a tie after five kicks, the team manager will select five players other than the five who already kicked, in a sudden victory situation.
 - i) Whereas one team scores, and the other team does not, the scoring team is declared the winner
 - h. During the kicks- All other players must remain in the center circle of the field.

- 10. Games consist of two forty-five-minute halves with a five-minute half-time period.
 - a. Co-Ed: Up to 11 players on the field per team with a maximum of seven males on the field. If a team cannot field four females, they will need to play with less players overall.
 - b. Men: Up to 11 players on the field per team.
 - c. Open: Up to 11 players on the field per team. There are no gender restrictions during play.

6x6

- 11. Games consist of two twenty-five-minute halves with a five-minute half-time period
- 12. There will be no off-sides in 6 x 6
 - a. Co-Ed: Up to 6 players on the field per team with a maximum of four males on the field. If a team cannot field two females, they will need to play with less players overall.
 - b. Women/Men: Up to 6 players on the field per team.
 - c. Open: Up to 6 players on the field per team. There are no gender restrictions during play.
