

1st/2nd Grade Rec Baseball League Rules- Coach Pitch

These rules are intended to promote and preserve the sound traditions of the sport and the safety of participants. However, there is an inherent risk of major or minor injury from participation. Every individual using these rules is responsible for prudent judgment with respect to each contest, athlete and facility, and each athlete is responsible for exercising caution and good sportsmanship.

- 1) Game length is 75 minutes or 6 innings.
 - A new inning may not start after the listed time, unless the game is tied and there is enough daylight. One
 inning is the maximum to be played after the time limit. The volunteer umpire is the official timekeeper
 of the game. Start games on time and hustle between innings. If you have daylight, keep playing to get
 your games in.
- 2) A minimum of eight (8) players can start the game. Teams with 7 players or less will forfeit the game, although the game can be played with both teams' consent. Teams that play with 8 players may elect to not field someone in the pitcher's position.
- 3) Teams must bat their entire roster– All players must bat.
- 4) Teams can use 10 defensive players regardless of the number of players on the other team. The extra fielder will play in the outfield. The outfielders will position themselves in an umbrella configuration approximately the same distance from the base path. A short fielder is not allowed.
- 5) All players must play a minimum 3 innings at a defensive position, including playoff games. A player may not play the same position more than 3 innings during the game. Rotating players equally between infield and outfield is encouraged.
- 6) There is free substitution including the designated pitcher.
- 7) All players must wear the Recreation Department's T-shirts—Team sponsors are not allowed.
- 8) No metal cleats
- 9) All batters and base runners must wear helmets. Players are encouraged to bring their own equipment. WBL Rec will provide the basic equipment.
- 10) Catchers must wear full gear including chest protector, shin pads, and mask.
- 11) The designated pitcher (DP) will throw overhand to the batter. Each batter will be given a maximum of 6 pitches and 3 swinging strikes. **There will not be any called strikes or balls**. The pitching distance is 40 feet or as short as 30 feet if necessary to throw hittable pitches.
- 12) The DP may only coach verbally from the mound and cannot play defense. The DP should make every attempt possible to stay out of the field of play after the ball has been hit. If the DP unintentionally touches a batted ball the ball will be ruled dead, the runners will not advance, and the batter will return to the plate. No pitch will be counted. If the DP intentionally interferes with the defensive team's attempt to field the ball, the ball will be ruled dead, the runners must return to the last base they occupied, and the batter will be called out.
- 13) When coaching a team while on defense, a max of 2 total coaches can be on the field.
- 14) A player or coach may coach the base runners at first and third base.
- 15) The player fielding the pitcher's position should be positioned within a 10- 15 foot radius behind the <u>40</u> foot pitcher's rubber.
- 16) Bunting or chopping down is not allowed—There must be a full swing.
- 17) Infield fly rule will not be called- Intentionally dropped fly balls should be called out by the Umpire.
- 18) Leading off or stealing is not allowed- If a runner leaves the base early that team will be given a warning and the runner must return to the base. If it happens again the runner will be called out.
- 19) Players / base runners will not be allowed to advance once a defensive player in the infield has control of the ball.

- 20) Sliding Rule All close plays, a base runner MUST avoid contact or slide where the play is being made. Not doing so can result in an out for the runner involved.
- 21) **Overthrow Rule** An overthrow at first or third base will result in runners advancing a maximum of one base beyond any base they were advancing towards when the ball was overthrown. Only one player may advance from third to home at an overthrow at third base. If a runner is on base at the time of an overthrow, they may only advance to the next base. Runners will progress at their own risk. Any ball that goes "out of play" will result in runners being automatically awarded one base as described above. Umpires are the only ones allowed to call this rule.
- 22) **7 Run Rule** A team can score a maximum of seven runs in their half of any inning. This includes the last inning. If a team leads by more than 7 runs before the last inning the trailing team should still have their chance at bat.
- 23) **Rain-Out Policy** In the event of a rainout, the league director will send an email to all head coaches if games are canceled anytime before 4:30 pm. If head coaches do not receive an email by 4:30 pm, teams should show up at the fields for a final decision on the status of the game. At the game, both coaches and umpires will decide if the game is to be played. If the severe weather siren sounds the game should be discontinued immediately.
- 24) After 3 full innings have been played- A game is considered official (this is for any weather cancellations)
- 25) Umpires are volunteers and will be provided by the Home team- The away team can provide an umpire if needed.
- 26) The Coach is expected to address any assistant coach, player or spectator from their team who is physical or verbally interfering with the game. Teams should give encouragement to their own team and say nothing about or to the opposing team. Coaches, players and spectators can be removed from the game and area by Umpires or league directors. If baseball is not being played, games will end immediately and won't be rescheduled.
- 27) The maximum barrel diameter of a bat is 2 1/4 to 2 3/4 inches.
- 28) All protests are settled at the field
- 29) Baseball AssociationLimits— Players that participate on White Bear Lake Baseball Association teams or are members of any other traveling association teams, or are considered MYAS / Gopher State, Little League or Babe Ruth programs **ARE NOT ELIGIBLE** to participate in this recreational baseball program.
- 30) Game Ball: RIF 10 Baseball
- 31) Base Length: 60 feet

ADDITIONAL PLAY-OFF RULES

1. Coaches must pick up balls from the Community Services and Recreation Department.

*Place your games balls back in your equipment bag for future use

- 2. A coin flip before the game will determine the home team.
- 3. Rain-outs during play-offs will be rescheduled according to the following schedule.
- 4. Even if some games run past 8:30, you must complete each game unless there is not enough daylight.
- 5. Winning teams must update the Team Sideline website Coaches will receive an email to do so

Please remember that this is a recreational league. It is a league where the total participation is more important than winning a particular game. Let's keep the league in its proper perspective and <u>HAVE FUN!</u>
