### General Information

3. Volunteer training requirements
  - Anyone working with or around the youth athletes on a consistent basis, **MUST** complete all required training and documentation. For example, a parent providing snacks following a game, would not be subject to the requirements. A parent providing assistance with equipment, stats, or practices would be required to follow these requirements.

### Practice Information

1. Cancellations
  - Weather-related cancellations will be communicated by the director.
  - If the school district cancels after-school activities, recreation practices will be cancelled that day as well. Other cancellations may be made by the director.
    - There are no scheduled cancellations on the schedule currently.
  - Practices may be cancelled at the coaches' discretion, but should be communicated to the director.
2. Practices
  - Three goals in making the schedule:
    - Accommodate volunteer coaches' schedules
    - Schedule younger teams earlier in the evening
    - Provide full-court practices for all 5th/6th grade teams
  - NVAA limits weekly practice times to 3 hours per week; Tri-Valley limits practices to 2 hours per week.
  - Makeup practices will be scheduled only in instances of cancellations from the department or school.
    - Brandon work hours: Mon-Thurs 7:30 AM - 5:30 PM (on-call during practices and games); limited availability Fridays
  - Coaches **MUST** let the director know if their team is or is not practicing.

- While most participants in recreation sports also attend PV schools, our recreation teams are GUESTS at their facilities. We pay for use of the gymnasiums and are expected to use only those areas and return them to the state we found them.
3. Available facilities
    - We have nearly full access to the ES gym and limited access to the MS courts.
    - No-use dates: 3/26 (musical), 4/1 and 4/2 (parent-teacher conferences); none for soccer

## Game Information

1. NVAA games are held at various locations throughout the season. Each team can expect at least one home game. Member chapters: Kersey, RYA (Keenesburg), Eaton, Platteville, LaSalle, Evans, Highland (Ault), Wiggins, Ft. Lupton
2. Tri-Valley games are held in Kersey, LaSalle, and Platteville. Each location hosts 2 Saturdays.
3. The game schedule is created and released by the respective leagues. Teams will be notified as soon as it is available online.
4. Game cancellations are made at the discretion of the host sites and league standards.

5. Problems at games
  - Code of Conduct/Rulebook
    - i. Coaches and parents are expected to set the standard for players; everyone is expected to positively represent our community.
    - ii. Zero tolerance policy
    - iii. Coaches can direct QUESTIONS at the officials when appropriate. Parents and spectators should NEVER address an official during the game and should allow the coach to coach. If an issue arises that needs attention, a site supervisor will be available at every location.
