

CODE OF CONDUCT

Players, coaches and spectators are expected to conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner. The LRC encourages positive experiences for all participants. Unsportsmanlike behavior directed toward other players, teams, officials, coaches and fans will not be tolerated. This includes, but is not limited to physical violence, obscene gestures, profanity, cheating, disrespect of coaches and officials, or other behavior deemed inappropriate. The onsite LRC representative has the ultimate discretion for enforcement of the code of conduct policy.

PLAYERS and COACHES

If a player or coach is ejected from a game, then that individual is automatically ejected for the next week (7 days) of games and practices. The player or coach may receive a warning but a warning is not required for an ejection to occur. A second warning results in an automatic suspension. The Rec Director will notify the LRC board, the player, parents of a minor and coaches of the suspension. In the event of a second suspension they player or coach will need to appear before the LRC director and/or an LRC representative prior to reinstatement of playing or coaching privileges.

SPECTATORS

If a spectator is removed from a game or practice by the LRC Director, an official or an LRC representative they are automatically ineligible to attend the next week (7 days) of games or practices. If the decision is made for a violator to leave, the game will not resume until he/she has left the premises. In the event of a second removal the spectator will appear before the LRC director and/or an LRC representative and the severity of the incident will be evaluated.
